## 2022-2023 Nebraska Youth Open and U23 Bowling Tour

## Full Rules (revised 7/6/2022)

- 1. **Eligibility:** Open to all USBC sanctioned youth bowlers whose birth date is 08/01/2004 or later and all adult bowlers whose birth date is between 8/1/1999 and 7/31/2004. All bowlers who turn 18 on or before 7/31/2022 must be sanctioned as adults before bowling the first event of the season.
- Cost: \$50 yearly membership fee, \$60 tournament entry (\$75 late registration); \$5 optional brackets, no limit; optional Junior Gold entry fee. Per tournament: \$22 lineage, \$25 awards and scholarships, \$5 to season finals, \$8 expenses. Membership fee is required upon bowler's second event of the season and goes toward the season finals lineage and awards.
- 3. Junior Gold Qualifying (optional): All events will be Junior Gold Qualifiers, provided the minimum number of entries is met. U20 Junior Gold qualifiers cannot be combined with U18 and below. There must be at least four U20 entries to hold a U20 qualifier. See rule #13 for full Junior Gold qualifying details.
- 4. **Entries**: Pre-registered/pre-paid entries will be accepted first. Walk-ins will be accepted based on availability. See *rule* #7 for registration information.
- 5. Divisions:
  - U12 Boys/Girls Scratch; birthdate 8/1/2010 or later
  - U15 Boys/Girls Scratch: birthdate 8/1/2007 to 7/31/2010
  - U18 Boys/Girls Scratch: birthdate 8/1/2004 to 7/31/2007
  - U23 Mixed Scratch: birthdate 8/1/1999 to 7/31/2004
  - Mixed Handicap: birthdate 8/1/2004 or later, average under 176; 80% of 200. The maximum handicap will be 90 pins per game.

**Note:** Divisions may be combined if there are fewer than 10 entries per division. Divisions will be combined first within age groups and then across age groups as needed to make a full division. A bowler who wishes to bowl in a higher age division than where their birthdate places them may do so, but once a bowler has voluntarily moved up in age division or moved from handicap to scratch, the bowler must remain in that division for the remainder of the season. The exception to this rule is if the tournament director combines age groups for a single event.

**Handicap Averages:** Starting averages for the Handicap division will be the highest book average on bowl.com for the 2021-2022 season. Bowlers whose first event is after January 1, 2023, will use the highest average as of 12/31/2022 for a minimum of 12 games. If the bowler does not have an established average on bowl.com, please provide a current league standing sheet. Bowlers unable to provide a valid average will bowl scratch. Handicap averages will be rerated every 10 games.

- 6. **Sport or challenge oil pattern:** All events will be held on a sport or challenge oil pattern. Pattern will be released the day of the event.
- 7. Registration: Pre-registration and payment is encouraged. Most events will fill quickly and have a waiting list. Walk-ins will be accepted based on availability per event. Walk-in entry fee is \$75. No-shows and same day cancellations will be assessed a \$25 fee to register at a future event, subject to tournament director's discretion.
  - Most events will consist of only one qualifying squad, but it may be necessary to have two squads at small bowling centers. Times and divisions for squads will be emailed and posted on Facebook.
  - Register online at TournamentBowl.com. Absolutely no email, text, phone, or social media messaging entries will be accepted this year. You must register online or walk-in.

- Pre-payment is encouraged but not required. Pre-pay using PayPal friends and family to: <u>neyouthbowl@gmail.com</u> or using Venmo to @torri-merten. Please add a note indicating bowlers' name(s) and the event name.
- 8. **Format:** The format for the Tour Stops will change throughout the season but will be emailed to all registered NEYBP bowlers and posted on our Facebook page at least one month prior to each event. (All Tour Stops will include a minimum of five games of qualifying and cut with finals.)
  - 8/7/2022 Big Apple Format: 5 game qualifier with cut to top 5 in each division for stepladder finals
  - 8/20-8/21/2022 Legacy Lanes Format: 5 game qualifier with cut to top 5 in each division for stepladder finals
  - Remaining Tour Stop Formats TBD
- 9. Scholarships and Payouts: Scholarships/payouts will be awarded at a minimum of a 1:5 in each division. The amount of scholarship/payout available will finalized the day of the event. Scholarship money will be deposited into bowlers' SMART accounts within 30 days of the conclusion of the tournament. Additional scholarship/payout money may be added on the day of the tournament. U23 bowlers (birthdate between 8/1/1999 and 7/31/2004) will have the option to take their payouts in cash or scholarship. It is the college bowlers' responsibility to know their limits for cash/scholarship awards to maintain collegiate eligibility.
- 10. **Tour Stop Tournament Dates:** Check-in will begin 45 minutes prior to each start time. Start times may be adjusted based on the center proprietors' discretion and changes will be emailed to all registered bowlers and posted on the Facebook Page.

  - 8/20-8/21/2022: Legacy Lanes, Monticello, IA; 2:00 pm on 8/20 (U12, U15, HDCP) and 10:00 am on 8/21 (U18 Boys/Girls, U23) \*U18 Girls may be moved to the Saturday, 8/20 squad based on number of entries.
  - 9/4/2022 Location/time TBD
  - 10/2/2022: Thunderbowl, Council Bluffs, IA; 9:00 am (Dual Pattern Event)
  - 11/6/2022: Westside Lanes, Gr. Island, NE; 9:00 am
  - 3/5/2023: Mockingbird Lanes, Omaha, NE; 9:00 am
  - 4/2/2023: Pastime Lanes, Hastings, NE; 9:00 am
  - 5/7/2023: Sun Valley Lanes, Lincoln, NE; 9:00 am
  - 6/4/2023: Hollywood Bowl, Lincoln, NE; 9:00 am
  - Season finals on 6/24/2023 and 6/25/2023 (see rule #12 for more information).
- 11. **Dress Code:** Collared shirts or bowling jerseys for boys and girls; slacks or dress shorts for boys; slacks, dress shorts, or skorts for girls. Shorts and skirts/skorts must be at least mid-thigh length in the front, back, and sides when standing, and a skort must completely cover the shorts underneath at all times, including when bowling. No jeans, shorts, sweatpants or yoga-type pants, hats, or sleeveless shirts will be allowed. Any apparel depicting cigarettes, alcohol, drugs or weapons will not be allowed. Tournament director reserves the right to disallow any apparel that does not meet these criteria and tournament director's decision is final.
- 12. **Season Finals:** Season finals will be held on 6/24/2023 and 6/25/2023. The format for the season finals will be finalized before the third tour stop. Bowlers must attend a minimum of five (5) regular season Tour Stops to be eligible for the season finals.
- 13. **Junior Gold Qualifying for 2023**: Participants in Junior Gold qualifying will be responsible for purchasing their 2022-2023 Junior Gold membership online.
  - Bowlers whose birth date is 08/01/2010 or later will participate in the U12 division. Entry fee is \$25.
  - Bowlers whose birth date is 08/01/2007 to 7/31/2010 will participate in the U15 division. Entry fee is \$37.50.

- Bowlers whose birth date is 08/01/2004 07/31/2007 will participate in the U18 division. Entry fee is \$50.
- Bowlers whose birth date is 08/01/2002– 07/31/2004 will participate in the U20 division. Entry fee is \$50.
- Note: a U20 qualifier will only be held if there are enough bowlers to make a complete division. U20 cannot be combined with U18 and below to form a complete division.
- The number of advancer spots available in each age group will be determined the day of the tournament based on the number entries that day, per division. The scratch scores from the bowlers' qualifying games will determine the bowlers' Junior Gold scores. Qualifying ratio is 1:4 entries per division. The first nonqualifier above the initial ratio with excess entries in each division can advance by paying funds to complete the entry fee.
- Junior Gold qualifiers will be announced before the start of the finals for each event.
- Ties for the last qualifying position will be broken by the highest single qualifying game between the tied bowlers. If a tie still exists after comparing all qualifying scores, a 9th and 10th frame roll-off will determine the higher qualifier.
- If there are not enough entries to have separate boy and girl divisions within an age group, a combined age group will be used. If there are not enough entries for a combined age group, divisions may be combined. If it is necessary to combine age groups/divisions, the lower age group bowlers will be notified and will decide if they want to proceed. If it is necessary to combine age groups only, the registered girls will be given the option to combine with the boys to make a full division. U20 cannot be combined with other age divisions. A combined age division will only consist of U18, U15, and/or U12 bowlers. In the case of combined age divisions, the entry fee for the highest division must be paid by all bowlers. A bowler may qualify through a higher division, but will still bowl in their current age division at Junior Gold.

- If a bowler qualifies for and decides not to attend Junior Gold in 2023 (Location still yet to be released by USBC), they must notify Junior Gold directly and notify the tournament director of the event where they qualified so that a replacement can be entered. Failure to cancel with Junior Gold by their stated deadline and/or failure to register at the 2023 Junior Gold Championships, may result in the bowler not being allowed to enter a Junior Gold Qualifier through a Nebraska Youth Bowling Partnership tournament in the future.
